PLACEMENT TEST

You will need to take a Humber online writing test to assess your English proficiency level.

- The Placement test consists of a written essay, and your writing will be scored on topic development, organization, grammar and vocabulary choices and correctness.
- A link to the test is provided after registration. The test must then be completed within a set timeframe.
- Humber faculty then assess the written submission and place you into one of the three ESL levels. Upon arrival, you may speak to your instructor if you feel you are in the wrong level and we will re-assess you.
